Mr. Leong, this is for you. It's just a small gift. Please keep an eye on my company.



Mr. Chao, I cannot accept it. It's too much for me.



How about this? It's really a small gift.

> Hm...My company has never set the limit of value of "small gift" that we can receive.





Take it then. When you purchase anything for your company, please remember us!

> It's only a small gift, it should not cause any trouble if I accept it...





The law Prevention and Suppression of Bribery in the Private Sector does not stipulate the amount of advantages that can be accepted. Employers can set up the limit of value of gifts received by employees in order to avoid the latter from breaking the law caused by temptations.

The so-called "advantages" include not only pecuniary advantages like money or gift but also non-pecuniary ones, such as school place, priority for job offer or a place of homes. Though these cannot be quantified in money value, they are also considered as the advantages indicated in this law.
