



Rules of conduct is not formulated by any law-enforcement agencies

Statutory norms:

The law provides provisions for various professionals (e.g. pharmacists, insurance agents, tour guides, etc.) to observe in execution of their duties. Hence these provisions are their rules of conduct. Meanwhile, the Labour Relations Law also provides general obligations for employees (e.g. loyelty, confidentiality), which also serve as rules of conduct.
